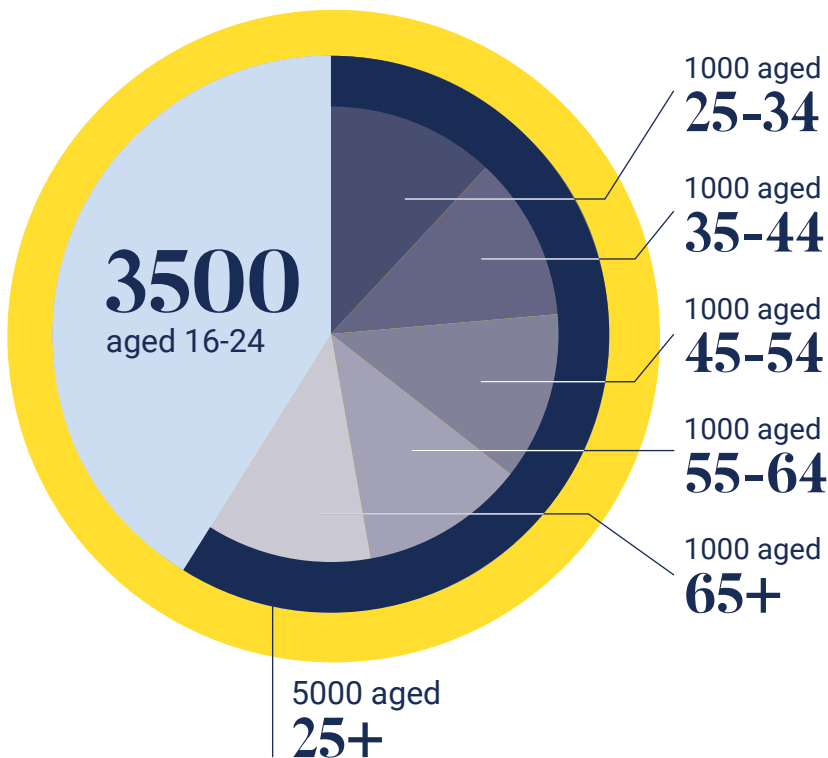


ACMS Methodology

The Australian Child Maltreatment Study is the first nationally representative study of the prevalence of child maltreatment and its associated health outcomes in Australia.

- ✓ Gold standard scientific approach
- ✓ Builds on prior work
- ✓ Refined, tested and validated survey instrument



Rigorous protocols to protect participants from distress and harm



8500 Australians were randomly selected. We collected data via computer-assisted telephone interviews in 2021.

What we measured

5 types of child maltreatment

- Physical abuse
- Sexual abuse
- Emotional abuse
- Neglect
- Exposure to domestic violence

4 mental health disorders

- Major depressive disorder
- Post-traumatic stress disorder
- Generalised anxiety disorder
- Alcohol use disorder

Health risk behaviours

- Tobacco use
- Binge drinking
- Obesity
- Cannabis dependence
- Self-harm
- Suicide attempts
